GUIDELINES FOR UNIT CONDITION CODES FOR EQUIPMENT INSPECTIONS

The condition rating is to give a general indication of the condition of the equipment. It should reflect both the mechanical and physical condition of the vehicle at the time of inspection. It will reflect both age appropriate condition as well as condition based on the use and maintenance of the equipment.

1. Above Average Condition

The engine compartment is clean and free of leaks, body is free of rust, only minor paint touch up or body work, the body and interior have minimal signs of wear or visible defects, all service is up to date.

3. Average Condition

Equipment would be considered to be in good condition for its age. The body may be in need of minor refinishing or touch up paint, has only minor rust if any, body has a few dents, chips, and scratches, interior has minor blemishes, engine compartment may have a few leaks.

5. Poor or Marginal Condition

The paint and body may require some refinishing, engine compartment has leaks that may need to be repaired, there may be some repairable rust, interior has substantial wear and may have a few tears, requires some mechanical repairs.
